Elizabeth M. Oliver, 62, formerly of Bangor, Maine, passed away peacefully surrounded by loved ones. Born on January 25, 1962, she was the beloved daughter of the late Maria C. Aponte and Jose M. Oliver.

Elizabeth was a proud veteran of the U.S. Coast Guard and later dedicated over 20 years of service to the United States Postal Service, working in both Ohio and Kentucky. She was also a skilled swimming instructor in Puerto Rico, where she lived for many years and developed a deep love for animals, rescuing countless dogs from the streets and giving them a second chance at life.

In 2005, at the age of 43, Elizabeth's life changed after a car accident left her a quadriplegic. Despite the immense challenges, her determination and spirit never wavered. In 2014, she discovered a passion for painting. With great effort and courage, she taught herself to paint freehand and created dozens of remarkable pieces. Visitors were often left in awe of her talent, and although many offered to purchase her artwork, she never sold a single piece. Her family will be donating many of her paintings in her memory—to serve as a reminder that no matter your limitations, you can still create beauty and achieve your dreams.

Elizabeth was predeceased by her parents, Maria and Jose, and her brothers

Jose M. Oliver and James Oliver. She is survived by her siblings: Charles Oliver, Frances A. Oliver, Jeannette M. Oliver, and Susanne M. Oliver (Carlton), as well as many extended family members and dear friends.

She was also predeceased by her two loving dogs Chippie and Bambi who she is now reunited with.
