George R. Brayton Sr, 96, died on August 20th, joined by his true love Dorothy Z. (Pierce) Brayton, 93, on August 25th.

George was born in Medfield, MA on February 18, 1925. He was the son of the late Walter Brayton and Ann Brayton Hagberg. He leaves behind two sisters, Barbara Dooley and Mara Duncan. He was predeceased by Walter Jr, Dorothy Waterman, Irene Gunsten, Donald, Shirley Brown, Gordon, and Ann Smith.

Dorothy was born in Providence on October 26, 1927. She was the daughter of the late Claude E. and Ina L. (Sweet) Pierce. She was predeceased by the late Ruth Eastman and Ina L. (Stubby) Wright.

George and Dot owned Brayton Milk Transportation for 26 years. He sold insurance and investments for Waddell and Reed and was a letter carrier in Foster for the US Postal Service for 17 years. After retirement he volunteered at the VA hospital for 14 years where he received volunteer of the year award in 2000.

They were members of the North Foster Baptist Church and life members of the American Ex POW's. George was a life member and past commander of Foster Memorial Post 101 American Legion and Veterans of Foreign War

along with Disabled American Vets. He was a member of Hamilton Lodge #15 Free and Accepted Masons and Past Master in 1978 and 1994. George was a POW in Germany during WWII for approximately 10 months.

Dorothy was a charter member of South Foster Fire Ladies Auxiliary.

They were also members of the Foster Preservation Society and donated the Winsor Blacksmith Shop to them in 1993. He received the community service award from the society in 1995.

They leave behind their beloved children, George R Brayton Jr (Laurie), Richard Brayton (Gladys) and Georgianna Knox (Donald) of Foster, RI, Rebecca Shippee (Warren) of FL and Donna Brayton of NY. They also leave behind 13 grandchildren, 14 great-grandchildren and 2 great-great-grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held on September 25th at 11:00 a.m. at the home of Georgianna and Donald Knox.
