John H. Weiss, 81, of Johnston, RI, passed away peacefully at home on February 14, 2026.

Born February 7, 1945, in Sunbury, Pennsylvania, to the late Charles F. and Audrie M. (Fleming) Weiss. He is survived by his wife of 56 years, Carolyn S. (Light) Weiss. Proud father of Christopher E. Weiss, Eric R. Weiss, and the late Jonathan A. Weiss. Grampy to Devin J. Weiss and bonus grandson, Logan T. Parady. He was brother of Charles F. Weiss Jr. (Karen), and the late Judith Ann Weiss. Uncle to Andrew P. Weiss and Alison (Weiss) Stull.

John enlisted in the Air Force during the time of the Vietnam War and was stationed in Tan Son Nhut.

John was one of the first to be hired when the Electric Boat facility opened in North Kingstown, RI, where he was employed for 34 years before retiring in 2008. His proudest achievement at Electric Boat was when he was chosen to weld the initials of the Governor of Hawaii on the keel of the submarine USS Hawaii.

Over the past 30 years, he was involved in Vietnam groups most recently serving as president of VVA Chapter 273 and past president of the State Council of Vietnam Veterans.

John was a tireless and dedicated advocate for veterans, whose commitment

spanned generations. His devotion as a Veteran Service Officer (VSO) touched countless lives, particularly those of Vietnam veterans, though his support extended to veterans of all eras. For years, John worked selflessly, often behind the scenes, ensuring that veterans received the benefits that they deserved.
