



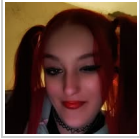
Leona Y. Pace

Leona was loved by all who knew her. She had a giving heart and would help anyone. She will be deeply missed by all. No services will be held per Leona's request.

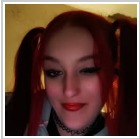
